

Checklist of Odonata Species of Inland Victoria

About half the species found in the state can be observed in the region. Below is a table listing the species Reiner has observed west of Melbourne north from the Great Dividing Range to the Murray River. He has included abundance as the likelihood of encountering them at their preferred habitat in central and western Victoria and indicated by the letters: **c**=common, **m**=moderately common, **u**=uncommon, **r**=rare.
