Other Common Names: None.

Family of Butterflies: Nymphalidae (Browns and Nymphs).

Size: Wingspan 48mm.

Local Records: This species is mainly found in the far south of our region in the taller forests around Lyonville. There is also a museum record from near Malmsbury.

Distribution outside our region: Most Victoria records are from the Yarra Ranges, Otway Ranges and coastal areas of Gippsland. The population in the Grampians is a different sub-species to that found in the rest of Victoria. Outside Victoria Bank's Brown occur along the east coast of Australia to as far north as Brisbane and inland to the ACT.

Larval Host Plants: *Poa tenera* and Wiregrass, *Tetrarrhena juncacea*.

Larval association with ants: None.

Adult Flight Times in Victoria: Peak flying is in March althoug there are a few records from as early as January and as late as May.
