Bright Shield Skipper (Signeta flammeata)

Other Common Names: Shield Skipper.

Family of Butterflies: Hesperiidae.

Size: Wingspan 30mm.

Local Records: There are two records on iNaturalist and Atlas of Living Australia from near Lyonville in the south of our region.

Distribution outside our region: Most Victorian records are from southern and wetter areas of the state. Outside Victoria, this species has been recorded from eastern NSW and the far south-east of Queensland. There are very few records on the inland side of the Great Dividing Range.

Larval Host Plants: Slender tussock, Poa tenera, and Wiregrass, Tetrarrhena juncea.

Larval association with ants: None.

Adult Flight Times in Victoria: July to March.
