Other Common Names: Cyril's Brown.

Family of Butterflies: Nymphalidae (Browns and Nymphs).

Size: Wingspan 35mm.

Local Records: There is a single 2017 record of this species in our region from Wombat Forest near Lyonville. In 2022 there were further records from this area.

Distribution outside our region: In Victoria most records are from the Yarra Valley and nearby ranges. There are other records from the Grampiand, the far south-west, Lerderderg-Wombat Forests and the far east. Outside Victoria records are mainly from the ACT and south-east NSW.

Larval Host Plants: Poa spp. and Wiregrass, Tetrarrhena juncacea.

Larval association with ants: None

Adult Flight Times in Victoria: Most records are from October-November with a few records as late as January.

Conservation Status:
