Local Records: All records from our region are from the higher areas to the south near Lyonville.

Distribution outside our region: In Victoria, most records of this species are from wetter areas of the south-west, Grampians and eastern highlands. Outside Victoria the are records from the Great Dividing Range in NSW, the far south-east of South Australia and Tasmania.
