First Circular, May 2025

The Field Naturalists' Club of Ballarat warmly invites you to attend the SEANA Spring Camp to be held on October 17-19, 2025.

Program

The camp will be based at Pax Hill Scout Camp. Full- and half-day field trips will be offered, visiting sites such as Woowookarung & Creswick Regional Parks, endangered grasslands, Trust for Nature-covenanted properties, lakes & waterfalls, Mt Beckworth, BirdLife Australia's Clarkesdale Bird Sanctuary, Mt Elephant and Enfield State Park.

The excursions will provide the opportunity to experience scenic landscapes and local botanising and birding hotspots. Enjoy and learn about wildflowers including orchids, land-use history, geology, endangered grasslands, woodlands, forests, wetlands, birds and conservation & land management themes across the Victorian Volcanic Plains and Central Highlands bioregions on Wadawurrung and Dja Dja Wurrung country.

Attendees are responsible for booking their own accommodation. A wide range of options are available in Ballarat. Some of the closer caravan parks and motels are listed on page 3.

A no-frills, low budget accommodation option is available at Pax Hill Scout Camp. We have the use of three cabins with toilet and shower facilities in a separate block nearby. There is room for three couples (or 3 x twin share) in each of these cabins. The cabins have bunks, but all six people will be able to sleep in the bottom bunks. Cost is \$40 per person per night. Please include this on your Registration Form if you would like to take up this option for your accommodation.

Attendees are to provide their own breakfasts and lunches.

Dinner is provided on Friday night at Pax Hill Scout Camp and on Saturday night at Ballarat Golf Club. Please note any dietary requirements on the Registration Form.

Registration and payment should be returned to Field Naturalists' Club of Ballarat by Friday 5th September 2025. Please note that numbers will be limited to 90 for Saturday night dinner at the Golf Club and to 20 people per excursion, so get in early to secure your place.
